Professor Geremie R Barmé is an historian, cultural critic, filmmaker, translator and web-journal editor who works on Chinese cultural and intellectual history from the early modern period (1600s) to the present. He is the Founding Director of the Australian Centre on China in the World (CIW), ANU.

Professor Gloria Davies is a literary scholar, historian and translator whose research covers a range of areas: Chinese intellectual and literary history from the 1890s to the present; contemporary Chinese thought; and studies of cultural flows in the digital age. She is Professor of Chinese Studies at Monash University and a member of the Monash Asia Institute and the Australian Centre on China in the World's advisory board.

Dr Jane Golley is an economist focused on a range of Chinese transition and development issues. She is an Associate Director of the Australian Centre on China in the World, ANU, and head of the China Numbers research stream. Jane was the president of the Chinese Economic Society Australia in 2010–2012, and continues to be an active member of that society.
